Dear Puppet Theatre Friends,

Under the slogan 'Touching is a Must', I am pleased to inform you about an educational puppet-theatre heritage project in a museum setting for the visually impaired and their sighted companions: *Een kijkje in de poppenkast. Horen voelen, doen en ontdekken / A look behind the scenes of puppet theatre. Hearing, feeling and exploring.*

This mini travelling pop-up exhibition – with a selection of puppets, figures and objects from our highly diverse museum collection – can be seen in the Dutch Puppetry Museum and on several other locations until the end of 2019. We hope to welcome and meet many visitors of all ages.

Mini pop-up project: I'm not blind, but my eyes are.

This exhibition comprises a number of tactile objects and about thirty figures in several forms of puppet theatre, such as hand puppet, rod marionette, rod puppet, mask, and marionette performances, Jumping Jack puppets, shadow puppetry, and wayang play.

There are twelve exhibition units, including:

- A puppet booth with puppets and props;
- Three chairs with figures as well as quotes in braille;
- An exhibition unit with a rod marionette;
- An exhibition unit with various puppetry figures;
- A puppet theatre display with a puppet head and a quote in braille;
- Displays with puppet theatre figures, objects and documents;
- Three audio displays with figures: spoken texts both in Dutch and English, international music, performance and sound clips;
- A monitor with European and Asian puppet theatre film clips;
- Two jester's costumes of a white clown figure in different fabric textures, materials, accessories and scents (rosebud, star anise, clove, and lavender). Additional: a white cane for the visually impaired, a marotte (a rattle with bells) – and a hand held squeeze whistle that emits a loud audible and high pitched whistle sound;

- Colourful puppet-theatre design rucksack and touch bag made of felt, with several cases and a word ('otto') in braille;
- Puppet theatre coffee and tea set with the head of the old-Dutch Jan Klaassen character. The set is made of stoneware and porcelain.



- Hand puppets: Guignol – Lyon, France, Jan Klaassen/Mr Punch en/and Katrijn/Judy – The Netherlands/Great Britain, Kasperl – Germany, crocodile, museum director, and Pulcinella – Naples, Italy;
- Rod puppets: knight figure and Tchantchès – Sicily, Italy and Liège, Belgium;
- Wayang kulit figures – leather shadow puppets: the Dutch Jan Klaassen, Kancil (little mouse-deer), Petruk (clown), crocodile, and Yudistira (prince, brass figure) – Indonesia/Java;
- Wayang golek figure. Petruk – Java;
- Wayang topeng masks: Lion and Hanuman (monkey) – Java;
- Jumping Jack puppet: Pinocchio – Italy;
- Marionette: horse – Myanmar/Burma;
- Shadow figures: Karagöz and Hacivat – Turkey;
- Puppet head ball (1982): Mr Bouncing Ball – The Netherlands. Original design: ceramist Jan van Leeuwen (1943-1992);
- Marionette/rod puppet: Die Wache (The Sentry/The Guard).

Objects and props

Mask of Pulcinella, Mr Punch (cigar lighter), Garuda/mythical bird (wayang lamp), puppet booth, puppet theatre bell, carpet beater, organ grinder's collecting box, bat, and a clamp.




Puppet heads on sticks

Ghatotkacha/prince (wayang golek), Guignol, Jan Klaassen, Katrijn, Pulcinella, boy, girl, man with a cap, gnome, king, princess, grandmother, devil, and pig.



Materials

Wood, metal, leather, felt, wool, rice straw, plastic, fabric, baked clay, and paper.

Pulcinella half mask and a clamp. The clamp – a wooden fastening and connection system that is inspired by Pulcinella's mask, the Italian forefather of the European puppet clowns – is used for the exhibition's modules. The eye holes in this oval mask shape are used as a connector and, in this way, interlink the expo units. The 'bracket' also serves as a sort of curtain ring or clamp for the front cloth and stage opening of the puppet booth. It also functions as a suspension system for a few figures, objects, and texts in combined script.


