Another lovely print from the *Puppetry Museum collection*. Puppet theatre scenes with the traditional Dutch *Jan Klaassen* and his wife *Katrijn (Punch and Judy)* in England) are centuries old. These characters are part of an international repertoire. The show is played with glove puppets. *Kasperl* is the main character of German-language folk puppet theatre. He wears a pointed cap and originates from the Italian *Pulcinella*, one of the clown figures of the *commedia dell'arte*.

In marionette theatre Kasperl usually plays the role of servant. He likes eating and drinking, is uncomplicated, always jolly and full of jokes. His wife is called *Gretl*. In the puppet theatre at the Wurstelprater – an amusement park in Vienna – Gretel (Gretl) is *Wurstel's* wife (sometimes Wurstel is also called Kasperl). When he strikes the anvil with his hammer, he accidentally hits Gretel's head. She drops stone dead on the puppet theatre stage but lives again at the end of the performance.
