



#### Puppetry Museum placemat with Mr Punch, his wife Judy, their dog Toby and passersby

Try it yourself? Another exciting activity from the Dutch *Poppenspe(e)lmuseum* (*Puppetry Museum*). Cut out the pictures and stick them on a piece of cardboard or in a notebook. Arrange them any way you like. Write your own story next to the pictures and create a puppet theatre booklet.

**Mr Punch** is the main character of British folk puppet theatre, who originated from the Italian *Pulcinella* during the seventeenth century. Punch wears a multi-coloured costume. He has a pointed cap on his head with a little bell. He also has a pointed chin, a hooked nose, a high hump and a big pot belly. Mr Punch looks like the old-Dutch *Jan Klaassen*, the German Kasperl, the Hungarian Vitéz László and the French Polichinelle. His wife is called **Judy**. Just as her Dutch cousin *Katrijn*, she wears a mob cap. **Toby** is the name of the dog in the *Punch and Judy show*. He wears a collar around his neck. Toby's role is often played by a real dog that has been trained to fight with Punch. The dog not only bites Punch's nose but sometimes also sinks his teeth into the puppet's body. In doing so, he also hurts the puppeteer.
